CLASS HISTORY

Nineteen thirty-four was a big year for St. Johnsville because it marked the year that the Class of 1946 started school. Our first five years were spent in the Church Street Grammar School. In September 1939, we took our first big step—coming to the High School. The last eighth grade graduation held in this school was in 1942 when the future Class of 1946 graduated with honors. We had speeches just like the real Commencement. An outstanding part of the Graduation was a play, "The Spirit of America", which was directed by our advisor, Mrs. Feldstein.

The day of the Junior-Senior Banquet finally arrived and we journeyed to Hotel Johnstown for a gala evening of dining and dancing. Class Night followed and the juniors were made the butt of the seniors' wit and sarcasm. (We didn't mind though; our turn was coming.) Commencement came and went with the girls of the junior class carrying flowers for the senior girls and then we bade the Class of '45 good-bye.

In September 1945, much to our amazement, we found ourselves, at long last, the "illustrious Seniors" whose wisdom and behavior inspired the lowly underclassmen. With Mrs. Horne again at the helm, we embarked on our first senior activity—the Prom—which was held after mid-term exams. Our plans centered around St. Valentine and in keeping with the day Angelo and Elnora were crowned King and Queen of Hearts, with Carl and Dorcas performing the actual crowning and Ethel and B. Carter (a junior) acting as attendants. Despite a terrific blizzard during the afternoon, we had a nice crowd and passed a lovely evening dancing to Salvi Ferraro's orchestra.

The Junior-Senior Banquet was held on June 13 at Hotel Johnstown, a fitting climax to our social activities.

At last came the days which we had planned on and striven for—Baccalaureate, Class Night and best of all—Commencement, which brought to an end twelve long years of hard work and lots of fun. Thinking back over the years let us not forget those who have not been able to enjoy these pleasures with us—Anthony Dannible, Harry Hayes, Edward Jones, George Lyons, Herbert Patterson, George Schumacher, Avery Van Slyke, Kenneth Watkins, and Ivan Waufle, who are now in the Armed Forces, and Margaret Davis who has spent one and one-half years in a Utica Hospital because of infantile paralysis. On our last night we think of them, our teachers, and our friends and say good-bye to our Alma Mater with more than a little sadness in our hearts.
